

**COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP MAJOR – COMMUNITY & EXTENSION EDUCATION SPECIALIZATION (A.S.) INTERESTED IN
COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP MAJOR – COMMUNITY & EXTENSION EDUCATION SPECIALIZATION (B.S.)**

This model plan of study is presented as a suggested path to graduate in 4 years with an Associate of Science Degree with a major in Community Leadership and specialization in Community & Extension Education and a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agriculture with a major in Community Leadership and a specialization in Community & Extension Education. It is intended to be a useful guide; however, each student is unique and should review the Degree Requirements and work with their advisor to develop an individualized course plan that best fits their personal academic background and goals.

NOTE: This sheet should not be used in isolation. In order to graduate in a timely manner, students must consult their academic advisor on a regular basis.

Additional Bachelor's Degree Requirements:

1. A 2.00 cumulative CPHR is required as well as a 2.00 CPHR in the major and minor coursework.
2. Students must complete a minimum of 30 credit hours at The Ohio State University with at least 12 in the department in Columbus offering the major.
3. Applications to graduate must be submitted at least three semesters in advance.
