

2023-2024 Financial Aid Checklist

- **Create an FSA ID.** The financial aid process begins with the student and at least one parent obtaining his/her own FSA ID. The FSA ID allows both the parent and student to electronically sign the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
 - To create an FSA ID, go to <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/sign-in/landing>
 - **Note:** *The student and parents may NOT use the same email address.*
- **Complete the 2023-2024 FAFSA online at <http://fafsa.ed.gov>.**
 - Available **October 1, 2022**
 - **OSU priority deadline February 1, 2023**
 - You will use **2021** income information
 - For **School Selection**, use **The Ohio State University-all campuses** federal school code **003090**
 - **Note:** *Answer “YES” to the question, “Are you interested in being considered for work-study?”*
- **Check your FAFSA status online at <http://fafsa.ed.gov>**
 - Check 3-5 days after you file
- **Review your OSU financial aid award by logging into *Your Buckeye Link* at <https://buckeyelink.osu.edu/>.** Awarding typically occurs early-spring.
 - **Note:** The university will communicate via OSU webmail when your award posts as well as any verification items that need to be completed prior to awarding. Complete any financial aid checklists items required. **Pay attention to deadlines.**
- **Complete and submit the *Ohio State ATI/CFAES Scholarship Application*.**
 - **Online application available October 2022 at:** <http://ati.osu.edu/scholarship-application>
 - **Priority deadline February 15th, 2023**
 - **Note:** You must enter your OSU ID# and lastname.# to complete the application.
 - If awarded, you will be notified via letter in the mail with instructions on accepting your scholarship award.
- **Complete and submit *The Ohio State University Scholarship Universe Application*.**
 - **Online application available at go.osu.edu/ssa**
 - **Priority deadline February 1st, 2023 for internal; external scholarships available year-round**
 - **Note:** Log in with your lastname.# (assigned through admissions). To activate your lastname.#, go to <https://my.osu.edu>.
- **Investigate private sources** of financial aid for college, such as external scholarships. Check with your school counselor, local library, local businesses, county community foundation, and your parent(s) employers.

Note: *You must re-apply for financial aid and scholarships **each and every** academic year. The 2024-2025 FAFSA will be available October 1, 2023.*

Ohio State ATI/CFAES Scholarships: Best Practices

- 1) Complete and submit the 2023-2024 FAFSA by February 1, 2023. Some scholarships are dependent on financial need.
- 2) Complete and submit the Ohio State ATI/CFAES Scholarship application by priority deadline February 15th, 2023. Select "Wooster/ATI" as your campus location. **Note:** *Scholarships are nontransferable between Ohio State campuses.*
- 3) Be specific, and respond to every question. **Tip:** *Ask a parent, counselor, or teacher to proofread your application essays.*
- 4) If you have taken the ACT or SAT, request to have your test scores sent to The Ohio State University.
OSU ACT code: 3312
OSU SAT code: 1009
Note: *Test scores are not required, however, encouraged for some scholarship consideration.*

(Note: Students must register for at least six credit hours each term they wish to receive a Federal Student Loan, including Parent PLUS loan.)

***OSU Student Health Insurance is not included in the above expense total or estimated cost of attendance totals. More information can be found at <https://shi.osu.edu>. Students are automatically billed for student health insurance. They may WAIVE out of the insurance plan. Students who do not waive out of the OSU Health Insurance Autumn Semester must purchase it Spring semester.

NOTE: If enrolled in online courses only, Learning Tech Fee is waived and a \$100 Distance Learning Fee is applied.
